

DDC Implements New Web-Based Timekeeping System

The Defense Distribution Center (DDC) has begun using a new web-based version of the Automated Time and Attendance Production System (ATAAPS) to record the hours worked and the leave taken by DDC employees, improving accuracy and reducing time spent entering data.

This new version of ATAAPS will replace the former mainframe version that used a black screen with neon

green text and required timekeepers to navigate back and forth through several screens to enter data. "The new system's menus and drop-down boxes all have a familiar look to them because they are patterned after the ones we see on many Internet sites. This new system will allow less effort to be spent on timekeeping duties, improved accuracy of data input, and a reduction in the number of

payroll corrections," said Sharon Shaffer, Chief of DDC's Pay and Accounting Operations Division.

DDC Headquarters in New Cumberland, PA served as the test site for the new system which has been in use there since mid-April. "Switching to the new web-based version of ATAAPS has turned out to be an exciting process for our implementation team. Our training sessions have been

quite successful, and the new system has been extremely well received by the users," said Shaffer.

The web-based version of ATAAPS will be implemented at DDC's 23 distribution centers world-wide on June 13, 2004. "Our team is working hard to complete the roll out of the new system so all of our sites can enjoy these benefits," said Shaffer.
