## International Supply Officers Visit DDC

Supply Officers from Italy, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Norway, and seven other countries received the Defense Distribution Center (DDC) and Defense Depot Susquehanna, PA (DDSP) Command Briefs, visited the DDC Customer Contact Center, and toured the DDSP Eastern Distribution Center (EDC) on April 26, 2002.

These countries, which also included Latvia, Turkey, Canada, and South Korea, are benchmarking best supply and distribution practices in use at DDC and DDSP as well as lessons learned for their implementation and use during distribution reorganization activities in their own countries.

Several Officers mentioned in particular the similarities in the processes and philosophies being applied to the reorganization activities.

The group of eighteen Officers was part of the Navy Supply Corps School Management Course for Senior Foreign Officers. They visited New Cumberland, PA as part of a six-week tour of U.S. military installations focusing on supply issues.
