

DDAG ships 1.7 million meals to support the Katrina relief effort

“He was tired, but he’s still doing his part and then some,” said Defense Distribution Depot Albany, Ga. (DDAG) Joint Logistics Operations Chief MSgt Frederick “Tony” Brooks, USMC, of Forklift Operator Todd Padgett.

“Our rations warehouse personnel have been directly involved with loading, staging, and moving rations nonstop,” added MSgt Brooks.

In addition to filling orders for other essentials like batteries and underwear,

DDAG employees filled 54 separate orders for a total of 143,536 cases of Meals Ready to Eat (MREs) that were shipped to areas of Mississippi and Louisiana to feed the tens of thousands of active duty and reserve military units supporting the Hurricane Katrina relief effort.


Each case held 12 MREs, enough to provide more than 1.7 million meals.

Fifteen other Defense Distribution Center (DDC) sites also shipped supplies to the area including MREs for civilians affected by the hurricane.
