

Distance Learning Technology Allows DDC Employees to Attend Fiscal Law Course

In February 2002, Defense Distribution Center (DDC) employees attended Fiscal Law, a twenty-two hour satellite course jointly presented once a year by the United States Air Force and United States Army Judge Advocate General Schools.

Each year, the Fiscal Law course broadcasts current instruction regarding the statutory and regulatory limitations governing the obligation and expenditure of appropriated funds and an insight into current fiscal issues within the Federal government and the Department of Defense. Subjects include the three basic fiscal controls (purpose, time, and amount); specialized instruction on topics such as Anti-

deficiency Act investigations, revolving funds, nonappropriated funds, military construction funding, liability of accountable officers, reprogramming, payment and collection, and continuing resolution authority.

The course, presented via satellite to 66 installations in four different time zones, was attended by over 1600 active duty service members and Department of Defense (DoD) civilians. Thirteen employees from Defense Distribution Center (DDC) and Defense Distribution Depot Susquehanna, Pennsylvania (DDSP) were in attendance, as well as seven employees from Defense Distribution Depot Red River, Texas (DDRT).
