PENNDOT Acknowledges DDC as a 10-Year Participant

The Defense Distribution Center (DDC) has been recognized as a ten-year participant in the Adopt-A-Highway Program. For a decade, the DDC Adopt-A-Highway Program has helped to spread the message that littering along our roadways hurts our environment and the participants care enough to make a personal contribution towards maintaining a cleaner community.

In February 1993 the installation teamed up with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PENNDOT) in a partnership for the Adopt-A-Highway program. The clean-up area encompasses a two-mile stretch on Old York Road that begins on a mountain summit overlooking the installation and ends at an iron bridge spanning the Yellow Breeches Creek into the heart of Olde Town New Cumberland.

DDC is also responsible for a combined one-mile area including Old Depot Road, which serves as the thoroughfare to the installation's primary security gate, and Normandy Drive, an access road for the Defense Distribution Depot Susquehanna, PA (DDSP) well-used by truckers.

On Earth Day in April and again in October, employees, military and civilian, bring their families out in rain, sleet, or sunny

weather to participate.

Orange safety vests, gloves and trash bags are provided and PENNDOT makes arrangements to have the thirty or more bags of litter picked up from along the roadside.

The "10-Year Participant" signs have recently been attached to the existing Adopt-A-Highway signs located along the designated roadways.
