The Family Advocacy Program is a Department of Defense activity designed to identify, report, treat, and prevent child and domestic abuse. On small installations like ours, the Family Advocacy Program Manager also has the responsibility for the Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Program.

If you wish to make a restricted (confidential) report of domestic abuse or assault, call the Family Advocacy Program Manager at 717-770-7066, the Victim Advocate at 717-770-3130, any healthcare provider at the USA Health Clinic at 717-770-7281 or the Chaplain at 717-245-3318.

These services are free to all Defense Distribution Center, Susquehanna civilian employees, military and their family members:

- Workshops on personal adjustment and wellness issues
- A licensed social worker to meet with you by phone or in person
- Web-based information on medical, family, legal, and financial matters
- Free library of pamphlets and videos. Over 300 titles on personal and family matters are available
- Crisis services for families at risk of child or domestic abuse
- Pre-Deployment and Reintegration briefings and materials for DLA military and civilians
- Weekly play group for military and DoD civilian parents and their children aged birth to five years

- In-home services. Military families may request a parent educator to come to your home on a regular basis, free-of-charge, to help you with organizing and managing your household or addressing your parenting concerns
- Respite child care. Brief, temporary free-of-charge child care due to illness, medical appointments, temporary duty, deployment or family stress, call the Family Advocacy Program for more details
- Sexual Assault Prevention and Response for military victims of sexual assault
- Exceptional Family Member Program
