

Veteran's Day Recognized at DDSP

During the week of Veteran's Day, a "Field of Honor" was displayed in front of Defense Distribution Depot Susquehanna, Pennsylvania's (DDSP) main building to honor those, living and dead, who have served their country.

The Field of Honor included more than 800 placards that were constructed from craft sticks and assembled by children attending the DDSP Child & Youth Development Services. DDSP employees, nearly half of whom are veterans themselves, wrote names of loved ones across the placards—red if the person was alive and blue if deceased.
