On November 7, 2002, Brigadier General Kathleen M. Gainey, United States Army, Commander, Defense Distribution Center (DDC), and Ms. Phyllis C. Campbell, SES, Deputy Commander, Defense Distribution Center, officially opened the DDC Conference Center Facility with a ribbon-cutting ceremony attended by DDC employees and key personnel instrumental in the design and construction of the facility. Also, helping to cut the ribbon were Mr. Frank Eichelberger, Lobar Inc., and Mr. Rob Montefour, DDSP Project Engineer.

The new state-of-art facility was designed to incorporate the latest standards, equipment, and technology, to provide a flexible and comfortable facility.

DDC's new conference center is 10,000 square feet and houses a 210-seat auditorium, a 32-seat executive conference room, and 90-seat capacity classrooms to include the DDC Distance Learning Center.

The audiovisual equipment is scheduled for installment in January 2003 and will include rear projection screens, sound system, wireless microphones and laptop computer connections.
